

BOOK HERE

In the modern, materialist world, which takes for granted the tenets of scientific materialism, the word 'imaginary' is often used synonymously with 'unreal'. However, in most traditional cultures the life of inner experience was valued as the source of richness and meaning that not only carried importances vis-à-vis the world of matter, but stood in counterbalance to it. Hence, in the Islamic tradition, every phenomenon in the outerworld (Zāhir) has its corresponding opposite in the inner world of spirit (bāţin). The uncovering of these inner worlds (or 'climates') is the goal of the spiritual seeker.

The discussions will be based on the publication *Swedenborg and Esoteric Islam* by the late Islamic scholar and perennial philosopher Henry Corbin. We will begin with the first essay titled 'Mundus imaginalis, or The Imaginary and the Imaginal', which addresses the topic of 'spiritual imagination' in both mystical Islam and the thought and experiences of Emanuel Swedenborg.

Henry Corbin (1903-78) was a philosopher, theologian and Professor of Islamic Studies at the École pratique des



This exhibition, curated by head of the Nordic library, Florence Chapuis, was organized to highlight a donation of books made by the Swedenborg Society to the Bibliothèque Sainte Geneviève last year. Items to be put on display include rare first editions of Swedenborg and Balzac; a 19th-century French play on Swedenborg; and a little-known *opera fantastique* in 5 acts, on Swedenborg's life

STRATA is a new exhibition and film installation by the artist filmmakers Cartwright & Jordan, who directed our acclaimed DVD on the life of Swedenborg, Heaven, Hell and Other Places and have been regular contributors to the Swedenborg Film Festival over the past few years. Drawing upon the archive collection of Experience Barnsley Museum, STRATA is a two-screen film installation that explores the social, cultural, industrial and natural histories underpinning the region's former coalmining landscape and communities.

In the context of post-industrial, deregulated, global capitalism, and the effects of extensive environmental and social change, the film captures the structural, ideological and cultural transformation of former colliery sites and communities. *Strata* makes connections between the industrial, communal and ecological genealogy of the region, contextualised with wider, international locations that are linked together through the <u>European Route of Industrial Heritage</u>.

The film will form the centrepiece work in the artists' exhibition. Alongside the film, the artists will be exhibiting new drawings, found objects, 3D animation and banners on loan from the National Union of Mineworkers (NUM) and Woman Against Pit Closures (WAPC). The exhibition forms part of *Meeting Point2*, a year-long project led by contemporary art agency *Arts&Heritage*.



The *Arcana* can be seen as a foundation for all of Swedenborg's later visionary works, including *Heaven and Hell* and *Divine Love and Wisdom*. It contains Swedenborg's clause-by-clause elucidation of the spiritual meaning in the biblical books of Genesis and Exodus, as well as descriptions of an incredible variety of his own spiritual experiences. It exists in English as a 12-volume set (translated by John Elliott) and is available to order online or at the <u>Swedenborg House Bookshop</u>.
